## St. Louis Narrative Background

- As a result of the narrative initiative, we are embracing our region through the STLMade movement, which aims to shine a light on the people, ideas, organizations, and businesses that are moving our region forward.
- The narrative initiative was guided by an Advisory Council of brand and communications professionals, from a variety of local organizations, and brought to life by local collaborators, including Broughton Brand Company, Cannonball, and Weber Shandwick.

- We've earned national attention for aggressively supporting multiple startup communities (T-Rex, Cortex Innovation Community, 39 North, OPO Startups, Downtown North Innovation District, and many others) and building towards a more diverse and equitable startup ecosystem.
- Our corporations and research institutions are collaborating in bold ways, creating new career opportunities, and earning recognition as leaders in industries, including life sciences, agtech, geospatial intelligence, logistics, and finance.
- Anchored by the NGA's investment in a new \$1.75 billion west headquarters in North St. Louis, our region is now one of the hottest markets for companies, entrepreneurs and talent looking to map their future in the fast-growing geospatial intelligence industry, which powers everything from the maps on our phones to sophisticated guidance systems for missiles.

### Tech & Innovation - a short list of sectors that are earning national recognition

- St. Louis was recently named a "Rising Star" in tech by the Brookings Institute. And the Kauffman Index said that in 2017, St. Louis saw the largest upward shift of startup activity in the country. With multiple distinct innovation districts (39 North/Danforth, Cortex, T-Rex, and OPO Startups), St. Louis provides the support our innovators, thinkers, makers, and doers need to make an impact.
- Home to more than 700 life sciences and agtech firms, the St. Louis agtech sector has been hailed by the Brookings Institution as a model for the nation.
- The development of the new \$1.75 billion National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) West headquarters in North St. Louis has established a foundation for academic and business partnerships that will help position our region for leadership in geospatial research, training, and innovation.

## Talent Development – a few examples of initiatives that are working to develop and attract talent

- St. Louis leads the nation in female entrepreneurs. Seek Capital named St. Louis as the city with more women-owned startups than any other metro area in the U.S.
- Greater St. Louis is one of the largest educational markets in the U.S. with 45 two- and four-year colleges and universities.
- LaunchCode, a non-profit started by St. Louis native and Square founder, Jim McKelvey, is creating new pathways to economic opportunity for people of all backgrounds aspiring to work in technology.
- St. Louis has one of the "Fastest Growing Immigrant Populations" according to the American Community Survey. A network of multiple organizations like the St. Louis Mosaic Project, the International Institute, and the New American Alliance, are in place to attract, educate, and support immigrants.

## Affordability & Livability – some of the factors that contribute to our higher than average standard of living

- US News & World Report recently named St. Louis among the top 25 most affordable cities in the United States.
- St. Louis Federal Reserve reports that the standard of living in St. Louis is higher than 94 percent of the MSAs (Metropolitan Statistical Areas) in the nation.
- Howmuch.net reports that St. Louis has the second highest rate of Millennial home ownership.
- According to PayScale.com, the St. Louis cost of living is 6% lower than the national average.
- Known as a "20-minute city," St. Louis consistently ranks below the national average commute time to work by the U.S. Census Bureau.
- St. Louis is the #1 most attractive metro area for millennials when it comes to spending power, giving
  young people more bang for their buck than 49 of the largest metro areas surveyed, including Austin
  (Multi-Housing News).



# Accessible Culture – highlights of the amenities that make St. Louis an exciting place to call home

- St. Louis is home to many free attractions including the Gateway Arch National Park, "America's Best Zoo" (USA Today), St. Louis Science Center, Citygarden, Pulitzer Arts Foundation, Laumeier Sculpture Park, Forest Park, The Muny, Cahokia Mounds State Historic Park, and Katy Trail State Park. - Our diverse and effervescent arts scene includes more than 56 must-see visual and performing arts destinations.
- Zagat (and others) called St. Louis "one the country's most exciting food cities", with James Beard award-winning and nominated chefs and restaurants across a variety of genres at a variety of price points. Being called the "essential Bosnian food capital of the U.S." by Food & Wine is a nice compliment, too.
- We're building one of the largest networks of hiking/biking trails (125 miles and counting!) in the U.S. that will connect our renowned neighborhoods, communities, rivers, parks, and institutions.

#### Urban Core Renewal - some of the exciting projects contributing to our transformation

- Approximately \$9 billion of development is currently underway or has been recently completed in and around St. Louis' urban core including: Gateway Arch National Park, NGA West headquarters, Cortex Innovation Community, City Foundry STL, Centene Stadium (MLS) BJC Campus Renewal, Delmar Divine, SSM/SLU Expansion, The Armory District, Ballpark Village Expansion, Soldiers Memorial, Adams Grove Apts, and several community development projects.
- Thereare 13 hotels currently in development along St. Louis' central corridor.
